Artist Statement

As a viewer, my work might draw you in as a celebration of lush or abundant vegetation or creatures within our natural environment, but after first glance, further observation will reveal that there is an accumulation of mundane, broken and outdated household detritus, normally destined for a landfill, within each piece. The work is simultaneously an insult and tribute to nature, for its very existence was likely due to the destruction of habitat and extraction of resources needed to manufacture the multiple items I utilize.

Enlarged to be impactful and impressive, the wall-to-wall installations of faux flora or super-sized fauna, the pieces are assembled with hundreds of mass-produced products. The work reveals the waste stream and excesses of the commercially abundant, industrialized and technological world I live in and the use of this debris speaks to my anxiety about climate change and the sustainability of our environment. I enjoy the challenge of creating art with repurposed materials that attempts to engage, surprise or enchant. I hope to encourage questions about what solutions exist for more thoughtful product design, sensitive manufacturing and building within architecture and interior spaces. In other words, if trash can still have meaningful purpose what steps for material resourcing have we missed along the way? Because of this, I have an admiration for clever solutions devised by those with a make-do and boot strap mentality: quilts and hooked rugs from former feed bags and old clothing, furniture mended and patched, tractors jerry-rigged to operate another 20 years.

My work is also inspired by the insects and other creatures observed in my own yard in central OH, as well as the mosses, mushrooms, lichens, and the cacti identified on hikes in state preserves and national parks across the US. The use of nature field guides is a large part of my creative process, to learn and train my eye to find small details and critical differences between species and to also be aware of native species vs. non-native species in my explorations. Another influence, perhaps the furthest afield, is the protea, a tough but beautiful and threatened flowering bush, that grows in the dry and arid fynbos biome of South Africa. All of these plants and fungi are particularly known for their rainfall needs or moisture retaining habits. And since several of my pieces are comprised of many old garden hoses, the work also begins a conversation in regards to water use and depletion.

My work is best when it ties the materials to the client, the cause or the concern. Most of my commissioned works incorporate objects from the field of the client and when possible, I encourage the organization or company to contribute their own specific items. For example, Domino's furnished old signage and pizza delivery car toppers, Promega's life science laboratory supplied graduated cylinders and Erie Insurance donated architectural elements from a historic structure on their campus, towards their respective projects.

Each tiny patch of our planet is unique and precious to specific plants, animals and insects. With eyes on our individual consumption decisions, and knowing that our footprint lands near and far, perhaps we can act more fully towards conservation everywhere.
